# Nourse

WALTER NOURSE, <i>Esquire</i> , son of Richard Nourse, purchased an estate at Weston-under-Penyard, in Herefordshire, England, and died in 1609	= CHRISTIANA, daughter of Sir FREDERICK WALL, of Lintridge, Gloucestershire, England
JOHN NOURSE, of Weston, <i>Esquire</i>	= JOAN, daughter of Sir JOHN KYRLE, of Much Marcle, Herefordshire, <i>Baronet</i>
JOHN NOURSE, of Weston, <i>Esquire</i>	= LETTICE, daughter of WILLIAM JONES, of Treewen, Monmouthshire, <i>Esquire</i>
JOHN NOURSE, of Weston, <i>Esquire</i>	= ANN, daughter of JOHN SMYTH, of North Nibley, Gloucestershire, <i>Esquire</i>

JAMES NOURSE, born at Weston-under-Penyard, Herefordshire, 19 July, 1731; to America, arriving at Hampton, Virginia, in 1769; in 1778, represented Berkeley County in the Virginia House of Delegates; died at Annapolis, Maryland, 10 October, 1784	= SARAH, daughter of GABRIEL and SARAH (BURTON) FOUACE, of London
GABRIEL NOURSE, 1754-1841	= MARIA LOUISE, daughter of JOHN and MARY (PHILLIPS) BULL
CHARLES NOURSE, 1801-1880	= SUSAN, daughter of DANIEL and SUSAN (CLINTON) CAMERON
JOSEPH GABRIEL NOURSE, 1826-1863	= ACHSAH SOPHRONIA, daughter of OREN and ROSANA (HAY) ABBOTT
CLINTON LAFAYETTE NOURSE	= EVA, daughter of Reverend EMORY MILLER, D.D., LL. D.
